



HUTT ST CENTRE

Is run by the Daughters of Charity and is a meal and day centre for the homeless people of Adelaide.

Men, women, and at times children attend the Centre. Facilities are breakfast, lunch, laundry, showers, lockers, counselling, referral, housing, and advocacy.

Each year over 2000 people, attend the Centre with approximately 51,000 meals being served.

ABORIGINAL CATHOLIC MINISTRY
